		On 12 May 2017, issued a final occupation certificate for a residential apartment building in Auburn NSW without attaching the required evidence to demonstrate compliance with the requirements of the Building Code of Australia (BCA) concerning the use of combustible cladding products on external walls.	exercising a function as a registered certifier create and store an index, in electronic format, of all records relied upon in relation to exercising the registered certifiers functions as a registered certifier as it relates to that development (each version of a record should be separately identified by the date of the version of the record);	

On or about 11 October 2021, contravened the Code of Conduct in the BDC Regulation by:

- issuing a construction certificate for a childcare centre in Bankstown NSW when the building works to which the construction certificate related had already commenced; and
- causing or permitting false and misleading statements in a record which the Registered Certifier submitted to the NSW Planning Portal

Between 15 February and 19 March 2021, issued three (3) complying development certificates for three (3) proposed complying 'group homes' in NSW when the proposed homes were self-contained residential units and not complying 'group homes' under the EP&A Act.
