## **Privacy information**

The Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998 (the PPIP Act) outlines how NSW public sector agencies manage personal information. - b) the individual concerned is reasonably likely to have been aware, or has been made aware in accordance with section 10 of the PPIP Act, that information of that kind is usually disclosed to that other person or body, or
- c) the agency believes on reasonable grounds that the disclosure is necessary to prevent or lessen a serious and imminent threat to the life or health of the individual concerned or another person, or
- d) the disclosure is permitted or required by an Act, including an Act of the Commonwealth, or any other law.
